Running shows, judging and simply encouraging Kerry owners in any way he could. Glen was a gentleman who will be remembered for a long time, and in whose memory we continue the club.

The last show was the Associations 23rd so this will be the 24th. This means a major milestone of the 25th Show will be next year in 2015.






